This lecture is associated with the 2009 Melbourne Winter Masterpieces exhibition Salvador Dalí: Liquid Desire.

Join us for this annual lecture on sculpture jointly presented with the Duldig Studio. Elliott H King is an art historian specialising in Dalí and Surrealism, with a concentration on Dalí's post-War art and writing. Educated at the University of Denver, the Courtauld Institute of Art, and the University of Essex, Elliott has been a pioneer in the critical study of 'Late Dalí'. He has presented extensively on various aspects of the artist's production in addition to contributing to major international exhibitions of Dalí's work.
