Art of the Table

NGV INTERNATIONAL 28 FEB – 31 DEC 2014 Decorative Arts Passage, Level 2



Porcelain plates, silver cutlery, sparkling glassware – a welllaid dining table is a work of art. The changing forms and appearances of these familiar objects over the past 500 years tell a history of the food we eat and how we eat it. Exploration of the globe brought new foods and drinks to the tables of Europe, requiring new equipment to facilitate their consumption. Shifting social patterns changed when we ate and with whom.

Art of the Table examines these histories through examples of dining wares drawn from the NGV's rich decorative arts collection, a significant proportion of which consists of objects related to dining and drinking.
