Shifting Gear: Design, Innovation and the Australian Car will survey our rich automotive history with a focus on Australian design and innovation. It will present 23 vehicles including muscle cars, racing cars, performance vehicles and concept cars. The exhibition will examine the design process and will feature some of the designers who have styled our iconic vehicles.

Through an interactive design studio *Shifting Gear* will bring to life the process involved in automotive design and will highlight the stages through which car design passes from concept to finished vehicle. The exhibition will demonstrate the significant contribution Australian designers have made, and continue to make, to the global car industry through design capacity and specialist knowledge.

Option 1

After Auto Mobility – Design a sustainable transportation vehicle for a post car world

Vehicles exist not as singular entities, but are part of a complex system of various infrastructures that enable their safe and effective operation. As their effectiveness reduces through exacerbated use and individual ideals, so does their value. With the automobile firmly embedded within Australian culture, what changes could be implemented for future mobility when independent ownership becomes an increasingly unsustainable practice? Where within this broad field can a substitute practice be established that delivers similar expectations yet considers our environmental and economic imperative?

Option 2

Automotive Engineering – Crash Testing for Dummies and Crashworthy Vehicle Design

In this crashworthy vehicle design activity you will explore the ideas used to design cars that better protect drivers and passengers. In a small group you will design and construct a 'crumple zone' to be attached to the front of a miniature test car, with the aim of minimising the peak acceleration reached during a frontal crash. You will then test your design by propelling the car into a mini 'crash barrier'. You will use a computer to record the peak de-acceleration of your vehicle and compare this value with those used by a professional.
