Body of work

Recommended for Levels 7–10, VCE

VCE Art, Units 1–4
Explore works of art from a range of contexts and practise interpreting them using the Analytical Frameworks – the structural, personal, cultural and contemporary.

Focus on methods involved in the preparation, presentation and conservation of works of art in the NGV Triennial, including curatorial considerations, exhibition design and promotional methods.

CREATORS AND MAKERS – EXTENDED PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS

Bring out the artist and designer in every student through an extended program incorporating creative practical art or design activities inspired by the exhibition. All programs include educator-led exploration of the exhibition, and are tailored to the level of the group.

Mathemagical pattern perfection

Recommended for Levels 2–6
Inspired by the myriad ways artists and designers in the NGV Triennial have used and created pattern, students will explore how to use kaleidoscopic colour, rhythmic repetition and symmetry to create their own perfect patterns. Elect to do this program with either traditional media or iPads (using apps such as Amaziograph, Isometric and Fragment).

What's your story?

Recommended for Levels 5–10
Many artists in the NGV Triennial tell stories inspired by their imaginations and the world around them. Students will be invited to tell a story of their own by creating a beautiful mixed-media miniature inspired by the narratives, techniques and styles of artists in the NGV Triennial.

Robopainter

Recommended for Levels 3–6
Inspired by NGV Triennial artists who use materials in individual and often unexpected ways, this workshop will challenge students to paint using coding and robotics. Students will write a series of coding instructions for our Sphero robots that will bring their coding to life in an explosion of vibrant, expressive colour and lines.

Design challenge

Recommended for Levels 5–10
What are the challenges and needs being addressed by contemporary designers? How do designers work? Following an exploration of a range of thought-provoking design works in the NGV Triennial, students will think like designers and participate in an action-packed workshop that pits teams against each other to complete creative design challenges.

Recycling creatives – wear it or use it

Recommended for Levels 5–10
Inspired by the creative way NGV Triennial artists and designers have responded to issues of sustainability, students will be invited to respond creatively to the challenge of using recycled materials to make their own wearable or usable object.

Explore and draw NGV Triennial

Recommended for Levels 4–10
