This drawing of a piece of lace is inspired by a border of lace made in Venice, Italy in the 16th century. Can you see things that are repeated in this lace pattern?

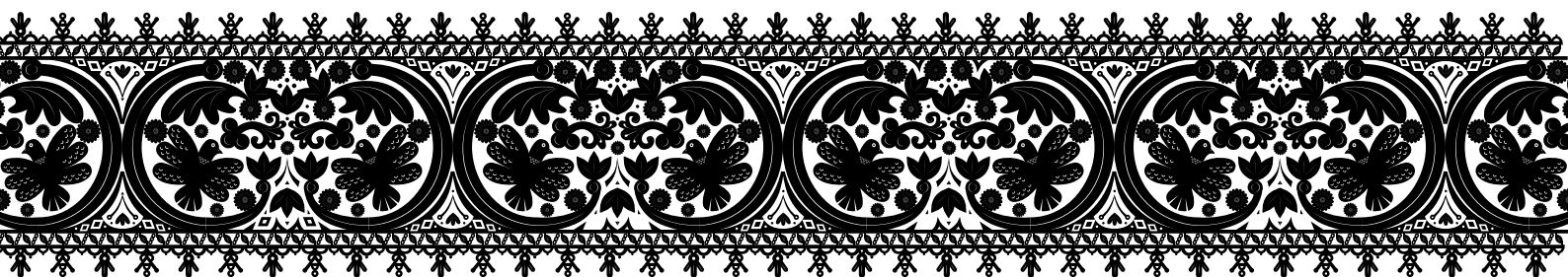
