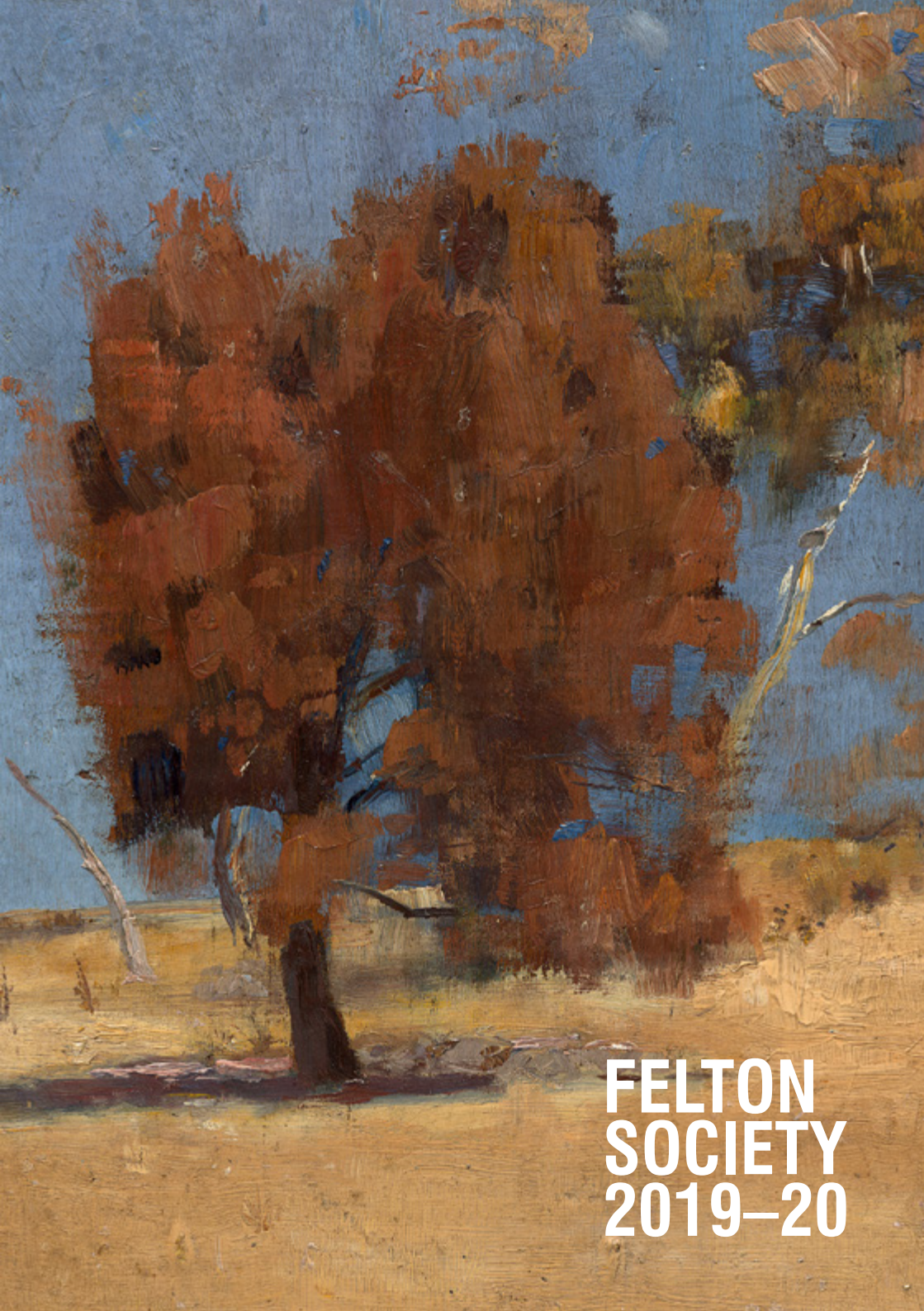

GROWING THE NGV COLLECTION

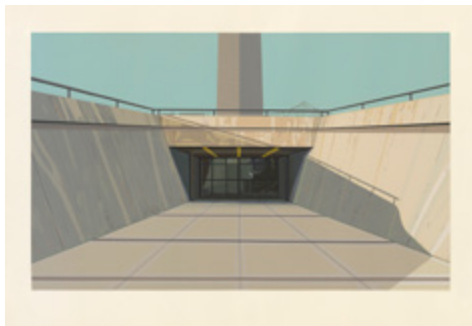

PROPOSED ACQUISITION

The NGV has an exciting opportunity to acquire *Urban Landscapes I* 1972 by American artist Richard Estes, a pioneer of the Photorealist movement, which saw artists create highly illusionistic images based on photographs.

Urban Landscapes I is the artist's first and most collectable body of work. It is a suite of eight richly coloured screenprints of astounding visual complexity, with each work presenting a highly detailed urban streetscape. By playing with perspective and reflections, Estes depicts an enigmatic vision of various American cities in the early 1970s. These scenes are devoid of people and narrative, presenting empty city streets that are particularly poignant for the world today in 2020.

This is a rare opportunity to acquire the complete set by an artist synonymous with Photorealism. The Gallery holds a number of significant contemporary Photorealist works and the acquisition of this important portfolio will introduce Estes to the NGV Collection and update our holdings to more thoroughly reflect the history of this movement.

2019 NGV ANNUAL APPEAL

In support of *Murmuration (Landscape)* 2019 by Cai Guo-Qiang, first presented at the 2019 Melbourne Winter Masterpieces exhibitions *Terracotta Warriors: Guardians of Immortality* and *Cai Guo-Qiang: The Transient Landscape*.

World renowned contemporary artist Cai Guo-Qiang is best known for his exhilarating gunpowder artworks. *Murmuration (Landscape)* is Cai's largest porcelain work to date, consisting of 10,000 birds suspended in mid-air and covered in gunpowder. *Cai Guo-Qiang: The Transient Landscape* was presented in parallel with *Terracotta Warriors: Guardians of Immortality*, creating a poetic installation that spoke to the history of the terracotta warriors.

THE ANDRÉE HARKNESS GIFT

The legacies left by individuals and their gifts of works of art have had the extraordinary ability to elevate the NGV Collection to new heights. Andrée Harkness' visionary collection was developed through her determination and passion for Australian women artists. For more than forty years, Andrée cultivated her collection, inspired by the quality of the works and their underrepresentation in the galleries she was visiting at the time.

We were delighted to present many of these works in 2018 in *Modern Australian Women: Works from a Private Collection* at The Ian Potter Centre: NGV Australia highlighting the work of more than fifty artists who worked between 1880 and 1960.

In 2019, Andrée kindly gifted to the NGV a number of major works, and this year, the NGV has gratefully received a further seventy works from her private collection. Andrée, who sadly passed away in April 2020, made a vital contribution to the life and future of the NGV.

Through her foresight, leadership and generosity in her lifetime and through her legacy, Andrée has enabled the NGV to present the true breadth of twentieth century Australian art for generations to come.

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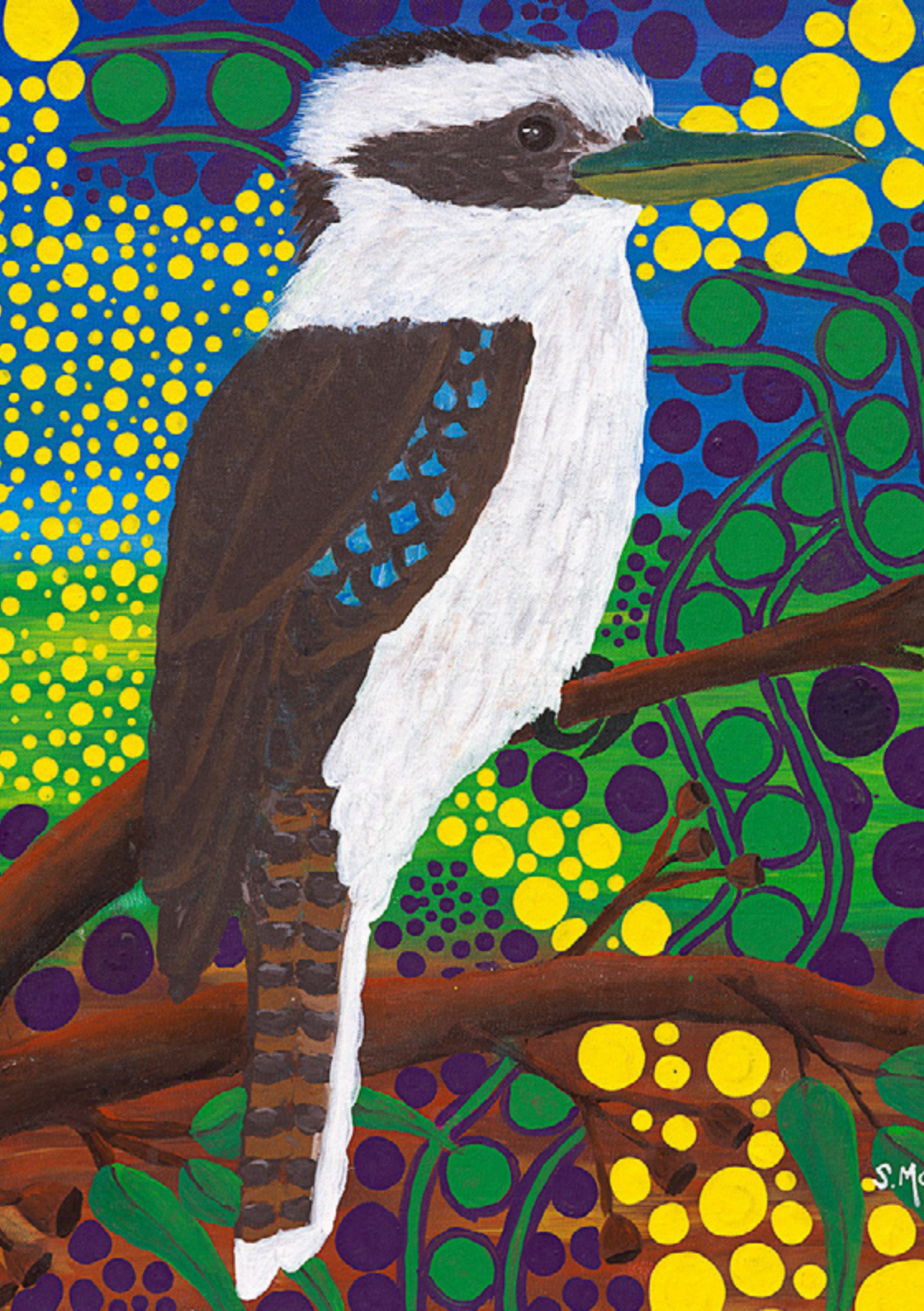
