## **CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE**

Across 2021–22, the National Gallery of Victoria achieved many remarkable goals with the extraordinary generosity of philanthropic supporters. Through the collective generosity of the community, the NGV Foundation was able to continue to build the NGV Collection, deliver exciting programs and events, alongside producing extraordinary exhibitions.

Over the past twelve months, there have been incredible milestones towards the NGV's landmark building project, The Fox: NGV Contemporary. In April 2022, the NGV announced an extraordinary and unprecedented pledge donation of \$100 million towards the construction of The Fox: NGV Contemporary from longstanding NGV supporters Lindsay Fox AC, Paula Fox AO and their family, which together with the Victorian Government's commitment makes this a truly once-in-a-lifetime project. This outstanding act of generosity sets a new philanthropic benchmark for Australia, making it the most significant cash donation made by living donors to an Australian art museum.

In addition to this remarkable commitment, the NGV was the recipient of a number of philanthropic successes over the past year. These included gifts valued at more than \$1 million from donors, including Krystyna Campbell-Pretty AM and Family's involvement across many initiatives and NGV Collection areas, such as Fashion and Textiles, International Art, Decorative Arts and Antiquities, Prints and Drawings, Photography, and the School Support Program. I also acknowledge the legacy of Sam and Nina Narodowski for a significant contribution towards The Fox: NGV Contemporary and the Dodge Bequest which also enabled the Gallery to acquire classical works of art for the NGV Collection. 

## THE FOX: NGV CONTEMPORARY

The Fox: NGV Contemporary is set to inspire, excite, and cement Melbourne's place on the cultural world map. Over the past 12 months, the NGV has achieved many milestones towards this already iconic project.

In March 2022 the Victorian Government and the NGV announced the winning design of the building and appointment of Angelo Candalepas as the lead architect. In April 2022, the NGV celebrated the extraordinary generosity of Lindsay Fox AC, Paula Fox AO and the Fox family's \$100 million commitment towards The Fox: NGV Contemporary. A landmark moment in the history of the NGV, Foundation Board member Paula Fox AO commented, 'On behalf of my husband and family, as long-time supporters of the Gallery, we believe in the vital work of the NGV in making the arts accessible to the wider community and we know The Fox: NGV Contemporary will be a place for all Australians to enjoy the best we have to offer. This gift is the culmination of many years of passionate support for the NGV, its acquisitions and its wider program. We believe in the impact of the incredible work of the Gallery, which brings joy to our community through art and design. We hope that our donation will inspire others in supporting this program to make this an icon for the future.'



## **ANNUAL GIVING**

The NGV's Annual Giving program brings together a dedicated group of the Gallery's supporters, contributing to one or more of the twelve collecting areas that make up the NGV Collection. Through this combined of Alexander McQueen works, including Boots, 2010, from the Angels support, the NGV is able to continue to grow the Collection with the acquisition of keys works, deliver exciting community programming and cement the NGV's position as a world-class cultural institution.

In return for their dedication towards the NGV, Annual Giving donors join a vibrant community of art and design enthusiasts whose engagement is carefully tailored to their interests through exclusive online and in-person events, as well as exhibition openings. Donors can also choose for their gift to go towards the Gallery's current priority at the time, such as the Annual Appeal, or appeals for unique acquisitions, such as the Gee's Bend Quilt campaign.

In 2021–22, the NGV's Annual Giving donors played a vital role in strengthening the NGV Collection. Thanks to the NGV Supporters of Indigenous Art (First Nations Art), the NGV was able to expand its collection of Indigenous fashion through the acquisition of Darwin Albertini, Adriana Dent and Dinon Wilson's Murranga print silk dress, 2021, as well as works by women artists with the acquisition of a video work by Kaylene Whiskey's Iwantja Young Women's Film Project, Kungka Kunpu (Strong women), 2019.

Through the dedication of the NGV's Supporters of Australian Art, the Gallerv was able to acquire Anne Hall's oil painting. Mirka Mora. 1967, and with the contributions of our Supporters of Contemporary Design and Architecture we welcomed Robert Baines's Philadelphia centrepiece: Candlestand, 2001-02, into the Collection.

With the support offered for Asian Art, the NGV was able to expand its holdings of Chinese and Japanese works with the acquisition of contemporary Chinese artist Chang Xugong's Singing woman, 2000, along with Smoking man, 2000, and a series of woodblock prints from Japanese artist Utagawa Hiroshige, c. 1847-48.

The Supporters of Fashion and Textiles continued to expand the Gallery's collection of British designers with the acquisition of a number and Demons collection and Look 12, skirt, 2009, from the Natural Dis-tinction. Un-natural Selection collection. We also formally welcomed designer Gareth Pugh into the Collection with the acquisition of Look 3, coat and dress, 2018.

With the collective funds from the Supporters of Contemporary Art, the Gallerv acquired the haunting short film Atlantic is a sea of bones. 2017. by activist and filmmaker Tourmaline. The NGV Supporters of Prints and Drawings focused their support on the acquisition of a number of works from contemporary Burmese artists. The NGV Supporters of Photography acquired American photographer, Eve Sonneman's Real time, 1968–74, and the Supporters of Decorative Arts expanded the NGV's holdings of American designers with the acquisition of work by Charles Eames, Ray Eames and Herman Miller, Storage unit, model ESU-400. designed in 1949-50 and manufactured in 1952-55.

The online series developed especially for NGV supporters, 'Spotlight on the NGV Collection', continued to deliver unique insights into the Collection. Since the series began in response to lockdown in 2020, the series has now had more than 12,000 views. The series has also been an effective fundraising tool, by delivering content specific to appeals, such as the Annual Appeal and Gee's Bend Quilt Appeal.

The NGV is grateful for the generosity of our dedicated supporters, whose involvement continues to be a significant part of life at the NGV. We thank all of our supporters for sharing their enthusiasm with the Gallery.






Through these in-person and online interactions, the NGV Foundation is pleased to have connected and deepened our relationships with supporters both locally and across the globe.



## **2022 NGV ANNUAL APPEAL**

2022 presented an exciting opportunity for the NGV to acquire a rare, seventeenth-century still life painting by Dutch artist Maria van Oosterwyck, *Still life with flowers and butterflies*, 1668. The NGV was humbled by the outstanding support of our community in enabling us to represent van Oosterwyck, a leading Dutch painter and pioneering woman artist.

Working alongside contemporaries Rembrandt van Rijn and Johannes Vermeer, van Oosterwyck was revered for her incredible attention to detail. With only thirty known works in existence, *Still life with flowers and butterflies* measures as one of the largest in scale. Van Oosterwyck was internationally celebrated during her lifetime, producing works for Prince Cosimo III de Medici, Grand Duke of Tuscany, King Louis XIV of France and Emperor Leopold I.

Representing women artists and designers in the NGV Collection remains an important focus for the Gallery. Overarching this collection strategy, the NGV strives to hold an encyclopedic collection of works for the benefit of the entire community, and the NGV Annual Appeal is instrumental in allowing us to fill critical gaps. Through the generosity of the extraordinary philanthropic community, we continue to strengthen our world-renowned Collection and tell fascinating stories. Dutch still life works hold great significance in European art history, and Maria van Oosterwyck remains a critical figure in the seventeenth century.

## NGV KIDS AND TEENS

NGV Kids and Teens programs and exhibitions reflect the NGV's commitment to providing creative experiences, especially for children, teenagers and families. By collaborating with leading local and international contemporary artists and designers, the NGV engages children and young people in the visual arts and cultures from all over the world, enabling them to experience the diverse and creative ways artists and designers approach their work.

Kids' exhibitions were a highlight throughout 2021–22, enabling the Gallery to share art and culture with the NGV's youngest visitors. We thank the Packer Family and Crown Resorts Foundations, City of Melbourne and Spencer Ko, for their support of *The Gecko and the Mermaid: Djerrkŋu Yunupiŋu and Her Sister*, which was attended by more than 73,000 visitors. Supporting the Melbourne Winter Masterpieces® kids' exhibition, *Making Art: Imagine Everything Is Real*, we also thank the Packer Family and Crown Resorts Foundations, the City of Melbourne, Spencer Ko for bringing the exhibition to life for more than 73,880 visitors.

The annual NGV Kids Summer Festival remains a staple of the Gallery's offerings for its diverse audiences. In January 2022, the NGV welcomed close to 20,000 visitors and the program included: daily dance parties for kids, hosted by Indigenous Outreach Projects; kids' disco parties and community group L2R Dance; movie screenings; artist-led workshops by Louise O'Brien, the founder of Architecture for Kids School and Wiradjuri woman Kristy Dickinson of Haus of Dizzy; plus, a teen program with stylist Aurie Indianna. The NGV warmly thanks the City of Melbourne for their support of this program.

The NGV Teens program continues to connect with this important audience segment through tailored programming. Exciting offerings, such as *After Hours* evening events and Drop-by and Make workshops served to demystify creative skills and career pathways, and connect more than 700 young people with art, artists, ideas and each other. ## **SUPPORTED PROJECTS**



## CONSERVATION

As Australia's oldest museum, and with a collection comprising more than 76,000 works of art, conservation is the cornerstone of the NGV. With the largest and longest running conservation department of any Australian museum, the NGV is a leader in the field.

Each speciality department contributes to the preservation of our cultural heritage through technical examination and research. A notable treatment during 2021–22 was the conservation of the frame housing Charles Cope's *The Pilgrim Fathers: Departure of a Puritan family for New England*, 1856. The large frame, totalling more than 11 metres in length, was made by Melbourne frame maker W.R Stevens in 1871 and is an important example of early frame making in Australia.

The NGV Conservation department continues to support regional galleries through material specialty webinars for members and affiliates of the Public Galleries Association Victoria (PGAV) that focus on collection management and care. This webinar aims to provide professional development to staff in the regional network by sharing the NGV's specialist expertise.

The NGV's Conservation department has also partnered with scientists from the Los Angeles–based Getty Conservation Institute (GCI) in a research project. Using advanced scientific methods, the project aims to assess international guidelines for museum collection environments, highlighting the ongoing discussion of adaptive and sustainable environmental practice in the cultural heritage field and the NGV's efforts in leading industry standards and sustainability in this area.

In 2022, the NGV was also the recipient of a grant generously provided from the Bank of America Art Conservation Project, which will focus on conducting technical research and conservation treatment on a series of highly significant works from the NGV's collection of Western Desert paintings, specifically early works from Papunya and Lajamanu – two remote communities in central Australia. To assist with this project, the NGV will recruit a Conservator of Indigenous Art.



## CONTEMPORARY DESIGN

Through the generous support of The Hugh D. T. Williamson Foundation, the NGV's Department of Contemporary Design and Architecture continues to make a significant impact on the life of the Gallery.

The department collects and presents thought-provoking contemporary design and architecture, through a dedicated and ambitious collection strategy. Throughout the year, works are highlighted through a thoughtfully developed program of events, exhibitions and programs. Key initiatives include Melbourne Design Week and the NGV Architecture Commission.

Since 2017, the Melbourne Design Week program has grown in scope and scale from just under 100 programs in 2017 to more than 350 in 2022. More than 55,000 people attended Melbourne Design Week 2022, which was curated by the NGV Department of Contemporary Design and Architecture team (Ewan McEoin, Simone LeAmon, Gemma Savio and Timothy Moore), making it Australia's leading and largest design event.

The 2021 NGV Architecture Commission entitled *pond[er]*, designed by a Melbourne-based team comprising architecture firm Taylor Knights in collaboration with artist James Carey, offered a space for visitors to cool off during the summer months and reflect on their relationship with the environment.

These programs are important platforms that underpin the NGV's ambitions, which create possibilities for individuals from all over the world to connect and engage in important discourse and knowledge sharing. Each program aims to challenge the way participants perceive art and design, broadening minds culturally and educationally.

## SCHOOLS ACCESS

Through the generous support of Learning Patron Krystyna Campbell-Pretty AM and Family, the NGV Schools Support Program has provided transformative learning opportunities to children who face barriers in visiting the NGV and accessing its exhibitions and Collection for almost ten years.

Because of ongoing restrictions to school excursions due to the COVID-19 pandemic this past financial year, the NGV School Support Program focused on providing online experiences for primary and secondary school aged students from regional, remote or isolated communities and to schools, who otherwise would not have the opportunity to participate in NGV programs. This included providing virtual introductions to 510 students from 21 schools for the Melbourne Winter Masterpieces® exhibition, French Impressionism from the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. The NGV School Support Program also provided these schools with art materials and a copy each of the publication Look Closer: Paint with the Impressionists to use in the classroom. In addition, this vital program also welcomed 344 students, 26 teachers and 23 schools to the NGV, who attended Summer School for Students: The World of Fashion at the NGV, and in-person programs associated with French Impressionism from the Museum of Fine Arts. Boston, and The Picasso Century.

Thanks to the leadership support of Krystyna Campbell-Pretty AM and Family, close to 17,000 students from across Victoria have participated in this extraordinary program since it began in 2013.



### EXHIBITION SUPPORT

The support of our wonderful philanthropic community has greatly strengthened the NGV's exhibition program, enabling the Gallery to deliver another exciting year of interesting and diverse exhibitions. Showcasing exhibitions across mediums and for visitors of all ages, the NGV is incredibly grateful to our supporters for their extraordinary generosity. We thank Major Patron Lisa Fox for her leadership support of *Bark Ladies: Eleven Artists from Yirrkala*, as well as the Australian Government's Indigenous Visual Arts Industry Support program.

Enriching the 2022 exhibition calendar, longstanding NGV Patron, Dr Pauline Gandel AC, generously shared *Golden Shells and the Gentle Mastery of Japanese Lacquer* with audiences, for which we are grateful. 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
